

Character Descriptions (While some characters are older, the director is willing to cast for the adult version, age 40+ actors and “age-up”. For the youth cast, we will age you with make-up):

Nick Cristiano	In his late 20's to early 30's and very loyal to his grandparents; career in advertising
Frank Gianelli	Nick's maternal grandfather, 75-80 years old; moved to America from Italy when he was 14; family focused
Aida Gianelli	Nick's maternal grandmother, in her 70s, quiet and matronly; all problems can be solved by food; wife of Frank
Nunzio Cristiano	Nick's paternal grandfather, in his 70s, loud and lovable; romantic family man; has a secret
Emma Cristiano	Nick's paternal grandmother, in her 70s, loud and lovable; all problems can be solved by the right spouse; wife of Nunzio
Caitlin O'Hare	Attractive and charming, in her late 20s; a nurse; Nick's blind date

Please bring headshot and resume, be prepared to do cold readings from the script. Men are asked to bring an instrument, if they play one.

THE STORY: Nick is a single, Italian-American guy from New Jersey. His parents retired and moved to Florida. That doesn't mean his family isn't still in Jersey. In fact, he sees both sets of his grandparents every Sunday for dinner. This is routine until he has to tell them that he's been offered a dream job. The job he's been waiting for—marketing executive—would take him away from his beloved, but annoying, grandparents. He tells them. The news doesn't sit so well. Thus begins a series of schemes to keep Nick around. How could he betray his family's love to move to Seattle, for a job, wonder his grandparents? Well, Frank, Aida, Nunzio and Emma do their level best, and that includes bringing to dinner the lovely—and single—Caitlin O'Hare as bait...we won't give the ending away here.
